

# Accelerated B.A. in History/J.D.

## Major Requirements

The major requires 36 credits of history courses with a grade of C or higher. These courses may include offerings at NJIT (HIST prefix) and Rutgers (510 and 512 prefixes). The accelerated B.A. in History/J.D. also requires a minimum of 120 total credits, including completion of the General Education Requirements (<http://catalog.njit.edu/undergraduate/academic-policies-procedures/general-education-requirements/>). Each student's program of study is subject to approval by an advisor or by the chairperson of the department. Specific requirements are as follows:
